
Application

Atto 465 is a novel fluorescent label derived from the well-known dye Acriflavine. The dye is intended for application in the area of life science, e.g. labeling of DNA, RNA or proteins. Characteristic features of the label are strong absorption and good fluorescence, large Stokes-shift, good water solubility and high triplet quantum yield. The dye shows intense and long-lived phosphorescence in solid matrix.
